The end of the school year is fast approaching. Please check the dates on the newsletter and also keep an eye on the school app with any further updates so that you do not miss any exciting school events. Please check that you have selected your child's class for individual class notifications on the app. If you are unsure how to do this, Frances is always happy to help.

Unfortunately, due to COVID Level 2 restrictions, we are having to make some adjustments to our usual Term 4 activities and other events we had planned. While we understand that this is disappointing for our students and school community, it is important to remember that all schools are having to make adaptations and changes due to the difficult times we are currently in. We will keep you up to date with any changes when decisions are made.

Vaccination Mandates - Parent Helpers

As you will be well aware we now have a mandate that all adults (including parents) working or volunteering in schools must be fully vaccinated by January 1, 2022. If you are yet to be vaccinated and are considering doing so, please ensure your first vaccination happens before 15 November. The school will be required to keep a confidential register of the vaccination status of all potential volunteers. More information will be provided when I have confirmation from the Ministries of Health and Education around this.

I will be working closely with the School Board to ensure we enact the correct processes and procedures for this new mandate. I really appreciate the emotion, complexities and outcomes of this mandate and will work to do my very best to lead you through this.

Class Placements for 2022

This is never an easy or straight forward task as we try our very best to manage the year group numbers, teacher placements and student placements in the best interests of our learners. These decisions are important to maintaining well balanced classrooms across the school and require hours of deep consideration on many levels. Each year we are presented with different scenarios and challenges in order to accommodate varying numbers in each class level. We are, therefore, not in a position to accommodate parent requests in regards to teacher preference, but we would really like to know if you have particular consideration such as peer conflicts etc that may be relevant to be addressed if possible. **If you are yet to inform the school that your child/children will not be here in 2022 please do so now as this has a big impact on our staffing, resourcing and ability to accept new enrolments. Thank you.**

School Donation

Thank you so very much to our families who have supported the school in paying the school donation this year. This is hugely appreciated and goes a long way to enable us to provide the high level of educational experiences here at St Pius X. Please remember, 33% of the school donation is able to be claimed back as a donation rebate via the IRD.

COMMUNION OF SAINTS

Each class have been learning about the Communion of Saints Strand.

The Communion of Saints is the belief of the Church that all of its members are joined in one great unity (in Christ) of belief and worship of God. This includes those now living and those who have died. The word saint means to be holy. All of God's people are called to be saints. Being in communion means to be connected - like a community. Our Church theology is not just about the 'ME' but the 'WE' so we pray together and for each other!

There are special saints that the Catholic Church have canonised (formally acknowledged their saintliness/holiness). You may have heard of saints like Saint Mary, Saint Joseph or Saint Vincent de Paul. They have been canonised for particular reasons. Like Saint Francis of Assisi is the patron saint of animals as he is a role model of having a deep care for animals and the environment.

Saints remind us that God chooses ordinary people that can go onto do extraordinary things!



The Gospel of Saint Matthew encourages us to be more like Jesus. "If you are good, you will be like a candle that shines brightly for everyone to see. And if they see that you are good then they will know that God is good." Matthew 5:15-17

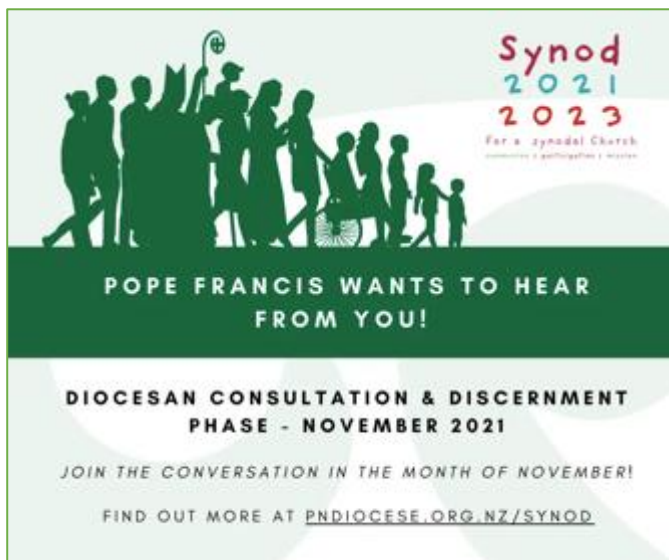
